If this is the case, the first syllable division rule that we try is V/CV (dividing up the word BEFORE the consonant). For example, in the word “robot,” we divide up the word before the b. This creates an open syllable, “ro,” that ends in a vowel.

The general rules of word division. The hyphen goes at the end of the first line, with the first letter of the rest of the word starting the next line. Do not divide one-syllable words. Do not divide proper nouns. There should be at least two characters (plus the hyphen) on the first line and at least three characters on the run-on line.

RULES FOR DIVISION OF WORDS | The general rule, then, is to divide according to pronunciation, not according to etymology or any hard and fast rule. As far as possible, consistently with pronunciation and good spacing, divide according to meaning and derivation, where known.

A single consonant in the middle of the word - Usually divide the syllable before the consonant. These words follow the spelling rules: A E O U usually say their names at the end of the syllable; and I and Y may say either their long or short sounds at the end of a syllable. If necessary for considerations of space or format, there are seven rules to follow. 1. Divide the word between syllables. This means, of course, that one-syllable words are never divided.

Apply the following word division rules: Divide words between syllables only. (Words with only one syllable cannot be divided: through, hearth, worked). Avoid dividing a word containing six or fewer letters. (Lines on a printed page may vary as much as six or seven letters in length; therefore, dividing short words such as letter or report is pointless.)
